They call her ‘The Smiling Nun’. Sister Sabra is a young African nun who carries out her mission in a girls’ church school in Malta. Like all European countries, Malta has been experiencing a rising tide of secularism. In the past few decades, churchgoers have nearly halved and the number of vocations has dwindled. Sr. Sabra is one of a growing number of young missionary educators who are carrying on the work of retiring Maltese nuns in church schools.

“The fire that we read about in books about this ‘tiny country with a big heart’ that sent out missions... that same fire is missing now,” says Sr. Sabra without sounding sombre. On the contrary, she’s full of energy and believes Europe will ‘soon’ wake up to rekindle its Christian faith.

Sr. Sabra is soft spoken and has dainty manners, but she does not lack the native wit and discipline that a teacher needs to manage a rowdy class. She jokes about adapting to a new culture... “My mission as a teacher in the school is still the same, except that in summer our live-ins are spent at the beach and not on the Serengeti plains!” With an irrepressible giggle, Sr. Sabra calls herself a “reverse missionary” - an evangelist from the former mission fields of Africa who believes that her calling is to revitalise Christianity in the country that first brought the religion to her.

‘Missionary Work’ often brings to mind stories of priest adventurers going to faraway countries to evangelise. But do I realise that I can be a missionary in my daily actions as a student, parent, son/daughter and at work? I do this by committing wholeheartedly to what I do and offering my work to God.
